

# CHECKLIST FOR THE PHYSICAL ARRANGEMENT OF THE STEM RESEARCH POWER POINT



**Participants will have a maximum of a 10-minute presentation of their power point presentation for the judges.**

- SLIDE 1: TITLE PAGE**
  - Title of project
  - Project Category
  - Indicate type of investigation either Experimental or Design
  - Student name, School and Grade
  - Name of Sponsoring Teacher
- SLIDE 2/3: ABSTRACT & SIGNED SAFETY SHEET**
  - Pictures of the Abstract & Signed Safety Sheet
  - Same as the Abstract & Signed Safety Sheet used in STEM Research Paper
- SLIDE 4/5: ENDORSEMENTS & ATTACHMENTS (If applicable)**
  - Pictures of appropriate Endorsements and attachments
- SLIDE 6: ACKNOWLEDGMENTS**
  - Credit is given to those that have helped with the research
- SLIDE(S): PURPOSE & HYPOTHESIS OR NEED/REAL WORLD PROBLEM**
  - Design Project - Define precisely a need or real world problem and propose a design solution
  - Experimental Project - Hypothesis and prediction are present
- SLIDE: MATERIALS**
  - All equipment and materials are listed
- SLIDE(S): METHODS OF PROCEDURE**
  - Step-by-step, chronological procedures are present and replicable
  - Drawings and photographs are present if they enhance and clarify the project
- SLIDES (S): RESULTS**
  - All data is presented, including results inconsistent with the hypothesis, if applicable
  - Data is quantitative and correct units of measurement (metric) are used
  - Data is organized into clear & informative tables or charts with accompanying graphs
- SLIDE(S): CONCLUSIONS**
  - Evaluation and interpretation of data is present
  - Refers to purpose and hypothesis or need/real world problem
  - Answers the original question
  - Is valid and limited to the results of the experiment
